# WORK WHILE YOU STUDY— AND BEYOND

With a New Zealand student visa, most international students can work up to 20 hours a week during term time, and up to 40 hours a week during the holidays. New Zealand also offers a post-study work visa, which lets international students who graduate from a New Zealand university work for any employer in New Zealand for a year. If you find a job that's relevant to what you studied, you can then apply to have your work visa extended for up to two years.

# **ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS**

### **UNDERGRADUATE STUDY**

IELTS overall band of 6 with no sub-score below 5.5; or

TOEFL 80 on the internet-based test; or

Pearson Test of English: A score of 58 (with a 'Communicative' score of not less than 50); or

A minimum of three ratings of 4 and one rating of 3 in the Victoria English Proficiency Programme.

#### POSTGRADUATE STUDY AND RESEARCH

IELTS overall band of 6.5, no sub-score below 6; or

TOEFL 90 on the internet-based test with at least 20 in writing; or Pearson Test of English: A score of 65 (with a 'Communicative' score of not less than 58); or

A minimum of two ratings of 5 and two ratings of 4 in the Victoria English Proficiency Programme.

The curriculum develops subject knowledge and skills as well as entrepreneurial enterprise, leadership and team skills to equip you for university.


